# Choosing qualifications in Year 9 allows you to:




- Choose courses and subjects that match your interests, abilities and talents

# There are subjects that you must study and you will gain GCSEs in these:



- English
- Mathematics
- Science
- Religious Studies

There are other subjects that you will study but you won't have an exam at the end:



- Careers Education
- Physical Education (unless GCSE PE)
- PSCHE
- Work Related Learning

- It is important that you choose options that interest and motivate you
- You are more likely to succeed if you enjoy your lessons
- Choosing well means you must think hard about:
  - What you are like do you like 'hands-on' subjects?
  - How different subjects will help you in the future
  - Interests, hobbies and ability
- Which pathway should I follow?



## **Choosing an Option**

- Research all your options before making a decision
- Do not fall into the trap of thinking some subjects are only for boys and some only for girls – this is not true
- If you have a firm career idea, choose subjects you need to meet the entry requirements for future study
- If you do not have a firm career idea, choose subjects that will give you plenty of choice
- Make the most of your careers education lessons and ask for help if you need it
- You need good information, advice and guidance to help you choose well


# Year 9 Options Evening
