


Submitting work on Show My Homework

As a student you are able to submit your assignments online instead of handing them in - as long as teachers have selected an online submission. When they do so, you will see this on your homework:

Jealousy in Othello

Iago first suggests the idea of jealousy to Othello in Act 3, Scene iii. From there, jealousy concentrates Othello's mind so completely on one idea - the idea that Desdemona has betrayed him with Cassio - that he can entertain no other assurance or explanation. This obsession totally removes Othello's ability to reason, his common sense, and his respect for justice. It is only once he has killed Desdemona and realises that she was innocent that he recovers.

Write an essay that investigates and discusses Othello's jealousy and Iago's role in this. How does Othello's character change when he is overcome with jealousy?

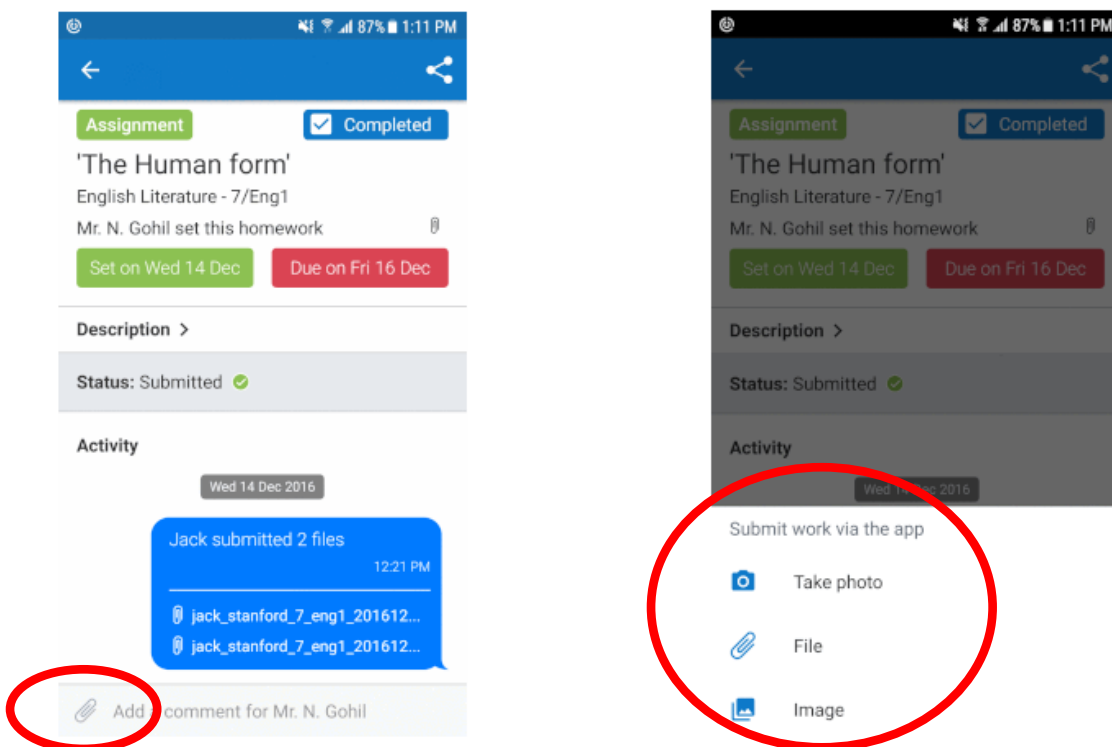
Using the mobile app?

You can also upload documents and images straight from your mobile device with the Show My Homework App.

There is no "Submit" button here, but for online submissions you will see a paperclip next to your comment box.

1. Tap on the paperclip 📎 next to the comment box
2. Select the location for the file, e.g. your picture gallery, a file stored on your phone, Dropbox or Google drive
3. Choose the correct file
4. Tap *Upload*

That's it! Your homework will automatically be marked as submitted. Your message and file(s) will be send to your teacher who will be able to download your work and share any feedback with you.
