- Every year in January we mark Holocaust Memorial Day. In 2020 this marks 75 years since the liberation of Auschwitz-Birkenau.
- In the years leading up to the Holocaust, Nazi policies and propaganda deliberately encouraged divisions within German society - urging 'Aryan' Germans to keep themselves separate from their Jewish neighbours. The Holocaust, Nazi Persecution of other groups and each subsequent genocide, was enabled by ordinary citizens not standing with their targeted neighbours.
- Today there is increasing division in communities across the UK and the world.
- Now more than ever, we need to stand together with others in order to stop division and the spread of identity-based hostility in our society.

- In 2017/18, there were 94,098 hate crime offences recorded by the police in England and Wales, an increase of 17% compared with the previous year. This continues a trend of increasing numbers of offenses recorded in recent years.

- What do we mean by **hate offences**?

- The police and Crown Prosecution Service have agreed a common definition of hate incidents.

- They say something is a hate incident if the victim or anyone else think it was motivated by hostility or prejudice based on one of the following things:

- disability

- race

- religion

- transgender identity

- sexual orientation.
